HURRICANE RELIEF: On October 18, following weeks of intermittent grid outages, ten million people lost power. On November 6, Hurricane Rafael ravaged the northwestern side of Cuba just above Havana, again knocking out the island's power grid and creating deadly flash flood and mudslide conditions. On November 10, a 6.8 magnitude earthquake shook the southern part of the island. Please pray for the
